So You Think YOU have Problems!

William "Steamboat Bill" Canfield is the owner and captain of a paddle steamer that has seen better days. He eagerly awaits the arrival of his college student son, whom he has not seen since the lad was a baby, expecting a big, husky man like himself to help him compete with businessman John James King and his brand new, luxurious riverboat. He is sorely disappointed with his slight, awkward offspring, who shows up with a pencil moustache, a ukulele and a beret. He becomes outraged when he discovers that his son and King's daughter Kitty, also visiting her father, know each other and are in love. Both business rivals are determined to break up the relationship. Made in 1928, with the artistic freedom at United Artists, Steamboat Bill, Jr. demonstrates Keaton's creative range and comic inventiveness in tackling everything from subdued, facial comedy to stumbling pratfalls.

DEAN MORA has enjoyed a rich and varied career as a pianist/organist, conductor, bandleader, music director, composer, arranger, and producer. A native of Los Angeles, Dean graduated from CSU Northridge. Shortly after college, Dean became involved with musical theatre (as an accompanist), and soon began to get work as a musical director.

Another major interest in Dean's career is the performance of American historical popular music and in 1994 he formed a 1920s/1930s dance band called Mora's Modern Rhythmists. This group has released 6 CDs to date, and is still performing around the L.A. area -- go to www.morasmodern.com for upcoming shows.

Dean was the piano/organ accompanist at the Silent Movie Theatre (located on Fairfax Ave. in Hollywood) until it closed in 1997. Dean continued to accompany films in other venues and festivals, from Chicago to San Francisco to Osaka, Japan.



High School graduates in cap and gowns paraded into Plummer Auditorium for their Baccalaureate ceremony Sunday June 13th to Elgar's "Pomp and Circumstance". First, Fullerton Union High School and later, Sunny Hills High School students celebrated their graduation with baccalaureate programs. Jack Townsend, Curator of the Plummer Wurlitzer Pipe Organ, played prelude music, the processional, the National Anthem and recessional music. In addition to "Pomp and Circumstance", he included Broadway selections from Oklahoma and My Fair Lady. "Gaudeamus Igatur", from Brahms's Academic Festival Overture was also performed.

Students and school officials made welcoming announcements and speeches appropriate to the day. A variety of songs and dance numbers were performed by students from both high schools.

The baccalaureate ceremony is a tradition born centuries ago to recognize the coming of age event of graduation with religious overtones. In the United States, separation of religion from government may bar such ceremonies from public schools unless the religious aspects are omitted.
